Thank you 22 volunteers and repeat volunteers. . . . Minnie Bennett and Donna Oldham were our OTTFA historians for many years and did a very good job. Both are dead now. Donna gave me all the material she had. I have it stored away. The other day I ran across a scrap book that the ladies had made. Here it was in my attic unseen. Many of the clippings went back to the 60s and 70s. I tried to think how I might share this material. Taking it to the convention would allow a few people to see it. I could type it but I knew I didn't have time right now to do that. I could put it off until this fall and hope that I might have time or I could forget about it. Later in the day I remembered how I got chairs set up at school. I would get a sixth grade class and 30 kids could do the job in minutes. So I sent out email letters to over 100 OOTFA members, asking for 10 volunteers. Would you believe that I got 22 -- as of this writing!! So I dug deeper into the archives and sent out close to 200 articles to be typed. They are coming back to me as email letters and I am putting them into a master document. Hopefully this will lead to "Oregon History Vol. 2." And it all will happen because of 22 volunteers across our state. I will forever be grateful to them.

Many of the people in the articles are gone, the events are forgotten and we don't know what a great job these people did -- or who they were. This book will allow these events and people to be recognized and remembered. And for us to better know where we came from in this association. Sadly it will contain many obituaries -- some long ago and some recent ones.

When we visited Dulcie Fast this winter, I brought home her scrap book. All of the articles are being typed and sent to me. Her scrapbook will live for ever!! And I am grateful.

Our history important. We are making future history every week end. Some districts take their history very serious and have a historian who collects and saves articles, etc. I received a letter from a lady recently whose family knew Rusty Modrell years ago. She wondered if I had any pictures or information about him. I went to the video archives and sent her an hour and a half video of Rusty. She was ecstatic.
