SOME TYPES OF JAMS.

1. OPEN: All instruments and styles of music are welcome.
2. INVITATIONAL: Also called "CLOSED." Only those invited may join in playing.
3. CIRCLE: all players sit in a circle and take turns calling a tune to play.
4. STYLE: Only one style of music is welcome, i.e., bluegrass, country, blues, etc.
5. SIGN UP: Groups of players who work together, or single bands, are given a fixed amount of time to perform. (this is a good type to use for performing for an audience).
6. FREE FOR ALL: Everybody plays together. All lead instruments play melody together and all back up instruments play together. They usually take turns calling the tune to be played. (This is a good jam for learning new tunes.)

There are also many combinations of the above.

WORKSHOPS: This is used to learn new tunes, polish up your skills, learn to work together and practice getting sounds balanced. It also is the place to work on getting the right notes or chords to a tune, and the timing right. This should never be done in the middle of a jam, no matter how much you would like to know how a certain passage was accomplished, or wish to show others how to do it. A workshop is not a jam. (To be continued next month.)


