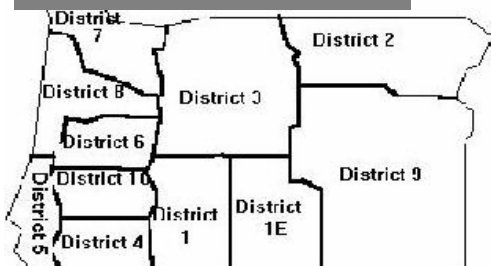
Fiddlers Association By-laws as follows:

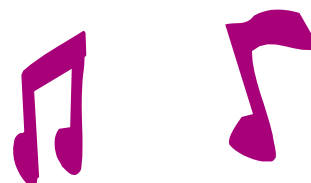
