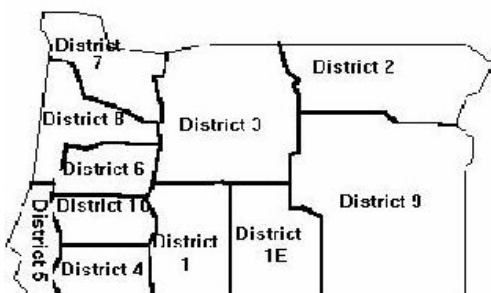
I also am challenging all fiddlers to enter the contest. If I can enter it and win third place, anyone can!! It is good fun, great camaraderie and you might even earn some money!

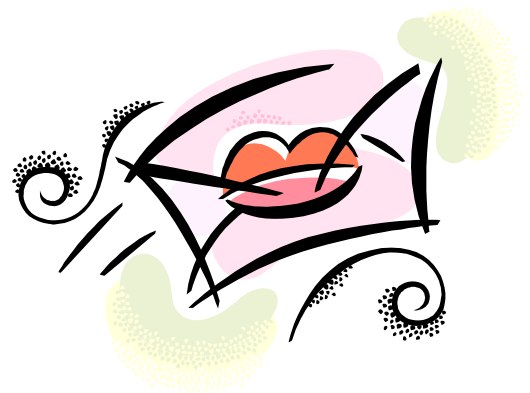
