
Greetings From your President

Our standing rules as quoted says: Instrument electrical amplifications, drums, woodwind instruments (except harmonica) and brass instruments are not permitted". I submit to you that when you snuggle up to a hot microphone and play your instrument, and that sound travels through a wire and comes out of a loud speaker you have played an amplified instrument!! Perhaps it is time to drag ourselves into the 21st. century and give acoustic electric instruments a try at jams and public performances. They would be controlled by running them through a central sound system. We can remain pure at contests. What do you think?
