

The featured musician for April was harmonica player, Pat Weyer, from Hauser. As a boy he wanted to play bagpipes but his grandmother told him a real gentleman was one who knew how but didn't, so he chose the harmonica, the only wind instrument allowed in the Old Time Fiddlers, and has become very proficient at playing it.

Harmonicas originated in China with bamboo reeds and were improved by the Germans with brass reeds and today are produced and played throughout the world in all sorts of venues. Pat says that playing or listening to

harmonicas, or any musical instrument, releases endorphins and dopamine which make one feel good even though, as a beginner, he was told by some one in the audience that he should go on stage---the first stage out of town.

The May featured performer at the Winchester Bay jam will be Bob Sackville-West, fiddler from Coos Bay. At the Brookings jam, on May 8, George Layton, auto harpist from Crescent City, CA, will be featured. For those of you planning to attend the Brookings jam, the Grange hall is on the right at the first light after you cross the Chetco River bridge. Hope to see you all

Drive in West Linn from 3:30 to 4:30 pm.


