

1230 Noon, Thursday, August 13, 1936.

I made my Mother very Happy that day. Both my parents were teachers, and both were musical. Mom taught me to play the guitar after I received a Kay F-hole, Archtop, concert model for Christmas 1947 from an Aunt. My Dad taught me to play his Gibson Banjo-Ukelele in 1939, and I played 2nd and 3rd violin in the school orchestra from 1943 to 1948, when I started playing the guitar I had received for Christmas '47. I'm still playing guitar today, more than 73 years later.

This month I would like to introduce Leonard Maahs. Alice and I moved from North Bend to Salem in 1993. We knew Leonard and his wife earlier. They and others made us feel welcome, never lost a step, took off running.

Leonard was born April 29, 1914 near Bennett, Nebraska. His father was an excellent fiddler and his mother played both piano and guitar. Between the two of them they taught their family music - all by ear. He moved with his parents to Julesburg, Colorado in 1930. Leonard, his sister, two brothers and two neighbor boys formed a band. They played for several years for barn dances and at the local dance hall. Leonard and Faythe were married in 1938. It wasn't until 1939 that Leonard got his first violin. A man owed him five dollars, and in payment gave him a Hope violin which had belonged to the man's grandfather. Leonard gave up fiddling for several years. With grain farming and dairying, raising three sons and putting them through school, there was no time for fiddling. He came to Oregon in 1954. He sold out and quit the dairy in 1964 and moved to McMinnville, where he worked for Coast Range Plywood for fifteen years.

In McMinnville, he met Clarence Greenlund, who got him interested in playing the fiddle again. He enjoys playing for dances, rest homes, birthday dinners, wedding receptions, house parties, etc.


Leonard and Faythe have ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He is hoping for a fiddler among them. He also enjoys fishing, but fiddling comes first. He has played for an Old Time Dance at the McMinnville Grange Hall every Friday night for the past seven years, missing only for rare illness or extreme emergencies. He also plays piano and organ, and even finds some time for gardening, which he is pretty good at, once you get him started.

Leonard likes to compete in fiddle contests and has won several trophies, of which he is very proud. He was Oregon State Senior champion in 1981 and has always placed in the top group. He enjoys meeting and playing with other fiddlers, both young and old and as far as he is concerned, there is always time for just one more tune.

Chance Mott belongs to a very special musical family. Not surprisingly, he's living up to the family tradition by learning to play music as well as jamming and performing at a young age. Chance is the grandson/grandnephew of our OOT-FA twin sisters: Janice Railton ("Nana") and Jeannette Bondsteel ("Nini"). Between these two high powered sisters are 14 grandsons and 1 granddaughter! – Chance is one of those lucky grandsons. Rocky Road to Jordan

This month we head over to northern Missouri for a tune from Bob Walters. I learned it from William Greene from Ashland. Typical of northern Missouri tunes, lots of quick little notes here; usually played in Missouri with small bow strokes in the middle of the bow.

I couldn't find a recording of Bob doing it, but there's a great version on YouTube by [Hammer & String](#), and a group of folks having fun with it [<here>](#). And YouTube also has a version by [Dwight Lamb](#), who was one of Bob's cronies and who is sometimes quoted as the source for this tune, because he first published it in his collection (after Bob sent him a recording).


We have been invited to play for several community events in the coming months. Our next Potluck and Jam will be March 8th. Hope to see everyone return and bring your friends and your instrument.
