FRIDAY, MARCH 21

Pioneer Building will open at 9 am Registration, jamming, banquet ticket sales all day. Banquet tickets are \$2.75 this year, and will be sold on a first come,

first served basis. At 8 pm the big Fiddle Show will be held in the Auditorium Building. Bring your friends. Admission will be \$2.00 for adults, children of grade school age and under \$1.00. Members with paid up cards for 1975 will be admitted free.

SATURDAY, MARCH 22

Janming all morning in the Pioneer Building. Building will open early. How early depends on you fiddlers; if you want it open at 7 am let me know.

BUSINESS MEETING-----1:30 p.m.

FUN DANCE TIME-----as soon as business meeting ends.
BANQUET----NORTH'S CHUCK WAGON, 20th & Willamette St. 6:30 p.m.

DANCE----for members and guests only at 8:30 in the Pioneer Building.

That's the outline of the agenda for the convention, but I hope each of you will read the following: Anyone who has a camper or trailer will be able to stay on the grounds as long as you wish, from Friday through Sunday. Restrooms are on the lot West of the buildings we'll be using.

There'll be a chance for you to help out with several chores that go with the convention: ushering at the show or helping Stage Manager, Jim Secor, see that performers get to the stage on schedule, helping at the soft-drink booth or in the kitchen. This year, I plan to have salads, snacks and burgers available to our members at cost on both Friday and Saturday. It will take people willing to help in the kitchen in order to do this. If you want to help in any way, let us know when you register Friday.

Plan to attend the business meeting at 1:30 Saturday. Don't let others decide things for you. Come and be part of it. I want to urgo everyone to stay after the business meeting and get in on the fun when we have Sue Reager show us some of the real oldtime dances like the Virginia Reel and the Contra Dances. Sue is one of the best dance teachers in the U.S., so don't miss out on this.

SPECIAL NOTE TO PERFORMERS IN FRIDAY NIGHT SHOW: In order to avoid some of the confusion that we experienced last year, we are going to try to follow the system used at the National Contest and have performers out of the Auditorium Building until a short time before going on stage. All performers will be on stage at the start of the show and then all but the first solo player and the 2nd and 3rd will go to the Pioneer Building. Jim Secor and his assistants will then see to it that you are brought back to the Auditorium Building at the proper time. If you will cooperate, the show this year will run the smoothest ever.

ABOUT TAPE RECORDERS: No objection to small hand-held tape recorders. As for the big reel-to-reel machines, let's keep it simple. We don't want the stage or the area in front cluttered with a lot of recorders.

PROPOSED 1975 CHANGES TO OUR BY LAWS

Article I addition: Any member in good standing, residing in Oregon shall be eligible to vote at the annual business meeting, held for the purpose of electing new officers, also at any special meeting that the officers of the association shall deem necessary to call. Time and place to be published in the newsletter, the Hoedowner, at least once prior to such special meeting. ADDITION - This shall also apply to each district.

Article III addition: Election of Officers by ballot: Addition "to hold an office a member must belong to the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association for at least one year prior to their nomination." First, President, Second, Vice-president. Third, Sec-Treas. In the event three or more names are nominated the two receiving the most votes shall be voted on again to determine the one receiving the majority of votes. The term of office, one year, unless re-elected. Addition "But not more than 2 consecutive years for state and district offices."

1972 Ammendment Changes:

State Contest requirements: Any member must be a resident of the State of Oregon six months prior to entering contest. Addition: "That there shall be five judges at any state sponsored contest."

1973 Changes:

Item I. That 20% of all "net" monies taken in by the districts from jams, contests, etc. shall go to the association. "Exception to this is money donated from outside activities."

Item 6: Word change from 'That the advisory board shall make a yearly audit of the treasurers report prior to the annual meeting. To read: That the president shall appoint a qualified person to make a yearly audit of the treasurers report prior to the annual meeting. This shall also apply to district books. That all checks, bank statements, receipts and any pertinent data be sent in for supporting documents on audit.
