PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Contest will be in Lebanon, Oregon, May 11th & 12th

1984 at the South Lebanon High School. There will be plenty of parking space, but no hook-ups. There will be a place to jam and pre-register available AFTER 3:30 PM Friday evening at the school. Please do not go to the school before that time as school will still be in session until 3:30. Bring finger foods for Friday evening. The contest for Seniors will start at 7:00 PM Friday. There will be no practicing or jamming in the Registration Room on Saturday morning. Other rooms and space will be available for this. It is the responsibility of the contestant to be at the stage entrance ready to play when his turn comes. Weiser rules will prevail. Each contestent must play a Howdown, a Waltz and a selection of their own choice, other than a hoedown or waltz. Novelty tunes such as Orange Blossom special, Listen to the Mockingbird, and Black Mountain Rag will not be permitted. All tunes must be of danceable quality. A time of four minutes will be allowed for your performance. The same number of places will be awarded as last year, including accompanists awards. All accompanists who appear on stage must be registered and pay a \$3.00 fee. Out of state accompanists may be used, but only Oregon residents are eligible for any award. State rules require residence in Oregon for six months and a member of the Association for six months. Five qualified judges have been chosen to judge the contest. They are as follows: Herman Johnson - Oklahoma, Brenda Wallace -Washington, Cynthia Bartlett - Washington, Johnny McDonald - California and Rusty Modrelk - Oregon. There will be a meeting of all fiddlers and judges prior to the contest Friday night and Saturday morning. Good Luck to everyone and may you all play and Have Fun!!!
