

Now we can go forward with our planning and try to make this our best contest ever. It was voted to present a bilaws change to the membership at our convention in March. Under STANDING RULES, Section X reads, "State contest will be held in May." The proposed change will add two words, "or June." So the new Section X would read, "State Contest will be held in May or June." You support and encouragement have been tremendous. I have been invited to go up soon to meet the Strawberry Festival people and to get our planning started. A couple of weeks ago I received a telephone call and to make a long story short, it went something like this, "We would like for your state fiddlers' association to put on a fiddle contest for our Elks Lodge and we will donate \$1250.00 for prizes and \$250.00 to the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association." "Are you willing?" Again, I was excited and I took the proposal to the quarterly meeting. The Board of Directors said, "Go to it." and the response from the audience was nothing but positive. I have contacted the Elks Lodge at Lincoln City to let them know that we are accepting their invitation to put on a contest at their campground south of Lincoln City - up Drift Creek - next September 17th. I propose to keep it as

There are probably other interesting divisions that we could create to have greater opportunity for participation (like a novice division for past presidents who have never entered a contest in his or her life). (Just joking!) Alice and I will be driving up the coast in the near future to meet the people up there, to look over the facilities, and to discuss the ramifications of holding a contest. I'll be sharing the information with you as I get it.
