

Try to listen to the accompanist or accompanists. I have heard many, many fiddlers play as though there were no accompanists there. Every

the Canyonville Oldtime Fiddle Contest, but every year it is a struggle just to break even. Frankly, I'm getting tired of struggling with it. I must face up to the fact that changes must be made.

I see the State Contest having the same problems. I fully understand the necessity of asking for cash donations in order to give cash prizes at the State Contest.

I have been asking individual fiddlers how important cash prizes are and the answers have been about fifty-fifty. Some say that trophies only is fine. That the contest is important, not for the prizes, but that it gives fiddlers a reason to work hard for improvement. Others say that the fiddlers won't participate unless at least small cash prizes are available. I have talked to only a small sampling of fiddlers and it is important that I know how the majority feels. **Please let me know** by writing or calling.

Also, I need volunteers for judging. Last year I only had two judges right up to the day of the contest. That is not a good situation. Remember, this is your contest and it can continue only with your help and encouragement.

their accompanists it will help them to keep proper time. (And if it should happen that the accompanists are not keep proper time, the fiddler can do whatever they can to remedy the problem. The fiddler must first listen, or they won't recognize that the problem exists.)

You will play the same way you practice. You can't just goof-off and half-heartedly play any old way when you practice and expect, by some miracle, to be able to play lots better when you want to play that tune in public. I once heard a man say, "I like to get all the bad performances out of the way when I practice, so that when I play in public they'll all be gone." What nonsense.

Virbrato. My personal feeling is: go easy on the vibrato. The two things that most clearly distinguish the violinist from the fiddler are these: 1. The way the instrument and the bow are held. 2. Vibrato. Violinists, of course, customarily use lots of vibrato. In every kind of tune (except waltzes) fiddlers customarily use very little. As far as the proper way of holding the fiddler and bow, I have heard some very good fiddlers who hold the fiddle in an unorthodox fashion, but maybe one could say, "yes, but perhaps they could play even better if they held the fiddle properly!" As for the "right" way to hold the bow, I say be must be held at the end. To play one's best, the entire bow is needed.

More Convention Notes from Gynn Deaton


