

We played many more times during the month.

At Thousand Trails State Quarterly meeting on Sep 14th, all districts were represented except #2 which I understand is not active. All districts gave a good activity report and

all are financially sound. There were some changes made in the standing rules and contest rules and I will list hem so all members will be aware that these changes were made. Stand rule V (5) was abolished in its entirety and rewritten to read:

To recall a state officer of the Oregon Old Time Fiddler's Association (OOTFA) 50% of all members in each district must sign a petition requesting recall and this petition will be presented to the executive board for final action.

To recall a district officer of the OOTFA, 51% of all members in this district must sign a petition requesting recall and this petition will be presented to the executive board for final action.

Under Rule XIV (14) Official Contest Rule M - general contest rule Item E was abolished and will not be in the future contest rules. This rule eliminated to many hard working members at our State Fiddle Contest. Also under Rule XIV, Rule M, Rule # 11, a motion made and passed unanimously that 5 judges will be selected not more than two from Oregon (exceptions illness & emergency) at the State Fiddle Contest in Corvallis. There will be no Sunday gospel Show due to economics. (At Lebanon, the OOTFA we were paid to put on this show, but at Corvallis we have to rent a hall for \$600.)

Another item that was discussed was to move the State Convention out of Roseburg to another location Starting in 1998. In 1998, the fees at the fairgrounds will be raised \$75.00 a day on each building making an increase of \$300 for the 4 days. Everything else will remain the same. Lew Holt was appointed to do some research and report back to the executive board at our Jan 12, 1997 meeting at Springfield.

Jack Kerr our Senior Vice-President is under the weather and is undergoing some medical

tests to determine the cause and severity of the problem. Jack, we all wish you the best and we know we will see you and Peggy at the mid-winter quarterly meeting in Springfield on January 12th full of pep and vinegar. We will be expecting to listen to your excellent voice when you entertain.

The State Mid-Winter Quarterly Meeting will be January 12th at the Willamalane Sr. Center in Springfield. I've asked Joy to arrange to have the doors open at 8 am for anyone who arrives early. I also instructed Myrtle Arnold to reimburse District #6 of any additional money to have this done.

DULCIMER OR DULCIMER

When you hear the word Dulcimer, what comes to mind?

I'll bet in District 9, Janet thinks about a trapezoid shaped instrument with some 46 strings or more wooden hammers. She's right.

Here in District 1E, I immediately think of a fretted stringed instrument, tear drop or hour glass shaped with 4 strings more or less. An instrument usually played sitting with the Dulcimer held on the lap. Sometimes played standing and once in awhile being bowed. I'm right.

Why is the name Dulcimer given to 2 completely unrelated instruments? those of you fortunate enough to hear the "Sweet Song" from these 2 instruments may have some ideas. When translated Dulcimer comes from the Greek "Dulce" or sweet and the Latin "melos", or song.

Now for a tiny bit of history about Dulcimers.

We'll start with the Hammered, sometimes referred to as a Hammer Dulcimer. It comes from one of the earliest musical instrument families, to give an idea of the dulcimers great antiquity, it is pictured in the ruins of Ninevah, an ancient biblical city, which dates to the 7th century B.C.

Dulcimers were not uncommon in early America. One is mentioned in the log of sailing ship bound for Jamestown in 1609. The instrument was a favorite of Henry Ford who included it in his famous "Henry Fords Old Fashioned Dance Orchestra".

Hammered dulcimers were manufactured in several New York factories in the mid-1800's and were sold by traveling salesmen, they were also available mail-order from Sears & Roebuck and Montgomery Ward. My copy of a 1902 Sears catalog does not list a dulcimer, however their most expensive model of an Auto-Harp sold for \$10.85. The dulcimer was a favorite of loggers in the North-western states nity to sound off. where it acquired the name "Lumberjack Piano".

The hammered dulcimer is widely distributed throughout the world and has many names. The Santur of Persia (Iran), Cymbalom of Hungary and Rumania, the Arabian Quanun and the Greek Santouri. China calls it a Yang-Chin.

I'm sure that when Janet plays the dulcimer, you'll hear the "Sweet Song".

Now for a quick look at the Appalachian or

The Hoedowner

Mountain Dulcimer, Sometimes called a fretted zither, also known as a "Hog Fiddle".

The dulcimer's first traceable European ancestor is the German Scheitholt whose first written description appeared in 1618. It was described as a small monochord provided at one end with a peg box posresting on a stand waiting to be played with small sessing 3 or 4 strings, all tuned to the same note except for the last string which was tuned an octave higher. The instrument was strummed with the thumb crossing all of the strings, the Scheitholt gradually found it's way to neighboring countries where design changes were made to conform to the local musical

> The Vosges mountains of France was one of the first places the Scheitholt was found outside of Germany. It became known as the Epinette des Vosges. Sometime later it traveled to Scandinavia. It first appeared in Sweden and was named the Humle. There it took on various shapes. The Swedes added iron tuning pins, a distinctive fret board and an elaborate scroll.

> Some years later the Humle appeared in Norway, where it was called the Langeleik.

> From Norway we move on to Iceland and a transformation to an instrument named the Langspil.

> Wherever the Scheitholt traveled, it was adapted to the existing musical culture.

> The Southern Appalachians were America's first western frontier. It was here that the Dulcimer as we know it today evolved. Many early Dulcimers took on various shapes resulting from the few crude tools that were available for construction.

> Most of today's Dulcimers are teardrop or hourglass in shape. It is unique among musical instruments with its diatonic fretboard and simple tunings. A common tuning to the key of C would be GGGC.

> The melody being played on GG and the GC used as drones, giving a bagpipe effect.

> I play the Dulcimer and hopefully before too long, I can learn to play the Dulcimer.


