



Notes from the editor:

President Roger has asked me to start compiling a history of the Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association. I have written to several people across the state who might be able to help with the project by supplying information about how their district was formed and/or who some of the early people were. If I did not write to you and you are able to supply information about the formation of your district or some of its early history, please contact me. I have already heard from several of you so I am off to a good start. Roger wants to have the material ready for the year 2000 - which isn't too far off when there is a lot to collect. What do you have to share?

This is a part of a letter I sent to a Fiddle List on the computer. There are about 600 people from all over the world on this list. I wanted them to know what we do in Oregon so I sent the following letter:

The Oregon Old Time Fiddlers Association rented the Lincoln County Fairgrounds for the week end for an APRIL FIDDLE FESTIVAL. The members wanted a chance to get together on the coast and have a good time. The first evening we were let into the fair building out of the chilly night air. About 25 of us sat in a circle and jammed until late in the evening. (10:30 is late at our age).

The next morning a group of us went to see Keiko - just as exciting as it is on the evening TV news. Others walked on the beach, had clam chowder or toured the bay front

We took up a collection to rent the hall Thursday afternoon and jammed inside where it was warmer. Since so many had arrived - many more than we had anticipated - we had a sign up jam that evening. We jammed all together on the stage for a half hour and then each musician played two tunes.

All day Friday fiddlers jammed through out the large fair building and we had a big show that evening with 58 signed up. We only had time for one tune each.

Saturday morning we had a picking contest - mostly for fun to entertain us and for the few that were there from the community. (Russ Phillips took first and Donna Oldham was second) That afternoon we had a two hour gospel show. That night we had seven bands that had been organized. Each band played for 26 minutes. The area in front of the stage was clear for dancing. That makes fiddling a lot more fun.

About ten days ago (before Newport) Gene and his wife who live in southern Oregon left their home and went to a meeting eight miles away. Somebody ran into the meeting to get an emergency worker saying that a log cabin was burning up on "Skookum Lane." Yes, that was Gene and Lola's. They hurried home and could see flames shooting from the upstairs windows. Gene went into the burning cabin in spite of the

firemen and saved one fiddle and some guns. This tragedy touched us and Saturday night our state president presented right at \$1000 to Gene and Lola to use as they see fit as they rebuild their log cabin and lives. There wasn't a dry eye in the house. We had set out a plastic milk jug that morning and the money poured into it all day. After we are able to tell others about their loss, we want to give other members across the state an opportunity to contribute. It shows how strong our "fiddle family" is here in Oregon.

One more little story. Saturday night after the "on stage jam" and just before the dance bands started, Alice and Norm twin fiddled "The Star Spangled Banner" as we so often play before we start our shows. Not only did they do well but by the time they got to the middle of the tune, 200 voices were singing along as they played. What a beautiful experience it was in a far off little corner of America to hear the beauty of the fiddles and to hear people express themselves with the words to this great tune. . . . just from their hearts. Thanks for listening.

Here is another letter I wrote to the Fiddle List. I thought maybe you might enjoy it: Greetings friends, I couldn't help but think of the fiddle list this afternoon. A group of us - three fiddles, two guitars and a bass - played our usual hour in the social room to actually an enthusiastic group in a nursing home. Nothing out of the ordinary - just the usual group but then a lady came in and asked if we would go come to room 19 to play for her sister-in-law's mother. The old lady had been an active piano player and had enjoyed music for many years but had suffered a bad stroke last Monday. I was told that they can't get her to swallow and that they really don't think she will live long.

When we finished we went down to room 19 where the lady's daughter and a friend were sitting by the old lady's bed. She was propped up in bed - her eyes were closed, the left side of her face drooped, the IV tubes dripped and there was really not much happening. We were told that she always liked to play Tennessee Waltz, Sweet Georgia Brown and would we end with Faded Love. That was easy - we could do that.

We started with Tennessee Waltz. The old lady's eyes opened and she looked far away. Her breathing became deeper. I couldn't but help wondering "where she was in her thoughts." All the time we played, she was attentive in her own way. We could see her thinking about something. The wheels were turning. She was unable to speak. Was she at the piano playing along with us? We hope that we touched her in some way with our music and gave her a brief moment of pleasure.

When we finished the three tunes, we were asked if we wouldn't play Amazing Grace before we left. I have never heard any of our tunes played with such depth, emotional involvement and commitment as those tunes were today. There was a depth and feeling in our tunes that I had never heard before and can't really find the words to describe. Today I wondered if we could play and have tears in our eyes at the same time. We can and we did. (The lady lived only a few days. We hope that our music added a bit of pleasure to her life.)


