In late August in 1988 Alice and I went to a campout near the little town of Williams out in the hills in South Western Oregon. One hot afternoon a bunch of us gathered down by the creek for a jam and visiting. I borrowed a video camera from Tommy and took almost an hour of close up shots of the old timers. Many of the musicians that afternoon were "older people." That was almost 14 years ago.

Last Sunday afternoon I took that video down from the shelf and watched it again. I had not viewed it for many years. The experience was both sad and happy. I went back in time and I was again with my old friends – watching and listening to them play. They laughed, told stories and played some neat old tunes.

There was Charlie Jensen standing in the shade playing his guitar – one morning several years later he went for a walk and was struck and killed by a car. His wife, Vi, a great old time fiddlers died a couple of years after that. Charlie and Vi lived in Monmouth.

Glen Brown from Myrtle Creek and I used to play many tunes together. One of our favorite times was at the Schaffar's in Bandon when we played "twin pianos." We went to his funeral years ago. His wife, Jessie, died several years later.

Jim Ramsey from Portland died a while back so his unique style of fiddling is gone.

Ed Doolittle is over 90 and isn't able to play much anymore. He built his own fiddle and played it down on his arm.

Calvin Boyles from Springfield is gone. He was a good mandolin and guitar builder.

Then there was Tex Cox and his harmonica. Tex was from Shingle Town, California but he left us a year ago. He was a cement worker – helped build the Bonneville Dam on the Columbia River.

And then there was old Bill Noble – a great old fiddle player and gentleman. If he had "been discovered," he would have been an old time fiddler in the national archives. But he lived out on the farm in Langell Valley and if you live that far out, you don't get discovered very easily.

Walt Westberry in a nursing home. His unique old style is silent. I suppose his little dog has been dead for years. Every night Martha would announce that dogs are to be on a leash and be sure to clean up after them. But I don't think Walt ever heard her -- or didn't care. Walt is from the Lebanon area.

I miss them all but through an old video, I was able to go back in time and spend almost an hour with my friends again. Music brought us together that week in 1988 and the old video took me back to that hot afternoon down by the creek to be with them again. Lew Holt
