From the Editor Emeritus =

Our OOTFA website serves many purposes. Some of you read the Hoedowner on Oregonoldtimefiddling.org or the PDF version put out by Hal http://www.hoedowner.info. Often I receive inquiries from people who want information about OOTFA or members - usually old timers. They find our web and write to me with their questions or comments. It makes me glad that we have a web.

I thought maybe you might enjoy this "memory" sent to me this fall by Jack Kerr. Buck Milligan was probably our greatest champion for "kid fiddlers." He sold T-shirts, wrote letters, did anything to help out the young fiddlers. Jack writes:

I was looking at one of my fiddles the other day and happened to remember that it was one of the ones that I had loaned to Buck several years ago for one of his students. We were talking about fiddling and tunes when he related a humorous incident involving his name. In his younger years he was "buckarooing" over in Montana where he heard a Native American fiddler play the tune Grey Eagle. He asked the fiddler if they could get together sometime so he could learn that song. They agreed that when Buck had some time off from work they would get together. This fiddler was quite a drinker and was having trouble remembering Buck's last name. Buck told him," suppose you needed some lumber from that sawmill just outside of town but they were shut down for a while and you couldn't get any. You would want to know when they were going to start the mill again. That sounds like my name, Milligan" A short time later they met and the fiddler said," Hi Mr. Sawmill"

I ran across the following that Buck wrote:

August 1984 President's message: "Weiser. Boy!!....now I am going to mention one name, and that is Bob Crump. Most of you know Oregon was host to the National Old Time Fiddle Contest this year. There has to be someone to organize all this and see that it goes well. So Bob took on the job of Director and really did it up right. Between Bob and our president, Leonard Maahs, it really went great.... Buck Milligan"

Hal is the chairman of the Florence Winter Folk Festival and has been instrumental in getting 60's folk icons such as Tom Paxton, The New Christy Minstrels, Tom Chapin, The Highwaymen, The Brothers Four and The Limelighters to participate in the festival because he knows and played with them over the last 50 years. He is also on the board of directors of several for-profit and nonprofit corporations and is active as a volunteer in the community. Hal is president of Weiner Consulting Services and has been involved in computers in medicine when he wasn't playing music.

There will be no January jam in Winchester Bay as that is the day of the state quarterly meeting which will be held in Emerald Park in Eugene. Let's all make an effort to attend that and enjoy the jamming there.


Tune of the Month: South Wind


