From the Editor Emeritus =

Story time. A young lady at our local pharmacy is the daughter of a sixth grade student in my classroom in North Bend about 1960. She told me the other day that she had wanted to go to the convention show but didn't make it. The next day I took her a DVD but she wasn't there. I left it with another clerk, telling him what it was. He told me that the grandfather of a friend of his was a champion fiddler. Naturally I asked what his name was. He replied, "Jimmy Miller." "From Tillamook?" I asked. "Yep." Jimmy was one of our charter members. Later when I was straightening upstairs I ran across an envelope with several CDs of the Banks, 1965 contest. Jimmy was on the CD. I took a copy down to the pharmacy to be given to the grandson of Jimmy Miller. The grandson called me saying that he was very pleased. I have found several newspaper articles, too, in the archives about Jimmy Miller which I will share. I just got off the phone

with Jimmy Miller's son, Jim Miller, who lives in Tillamook. I hope to have met him before you read this.

Another example of the value of archives is the old cassette tape I found ten years after Bunky McFee died -- telling about D-day, June 6, 1944. It is on our web site, Oregonoldtimefiddling.org. You can imagine the pleasure it brought the family ten years after Bunky died to hear him come back to tell his story of D-day. And twenty years after he had made the cassette for his family but never telling them. On May 25 the Statesman Journal will have featured Bunky and his cassette tape as a part of the recognition of the 70th anniversary of D-day, June 6, 1944. Those with a computer should find Bunky's document and pictures on the Statesman's Journal web. And perhaps the article in the Statesman archives. I hope you have checked out our web.



Adamek of Powers. The pegs, chin rest and tail piece are made of Coos County myrtlewood. The top is spruce of unknown origin. This fiddle, besides being beautiful, has a wonderful tone which is improving as it ages and she is very proud of it. Wally is also making a cello with some of the wood.


In his spare time, Michael loves to take apart electronic gizmos to see how they work. He would like to be an engineer and keep on playing the fiddle.
