

### For Contestants: A Brief Summary about What to Expect at a Fiddle Contest

If you're new to contests, here is a summary of how things work at the Oregon State Open Fiddle Contest. Even if it seems like a lot of information to remember, just be aware that there are many volunteers at the contest who will assist you with just about anything.

It's a good idea to pre-register (registration information is in the <u>January Hoedowner</u>). When you arrive at the contest site, you will see a registration table where you can check in (Please do this at least an hour prior to the start of your division – 2 hours is better – a tentative schedule is in the December Hoedowner). If you haven't pre-registered, you can do so at the contest. You can also <u>join the Oregon Oldtime Fiddlers' Association</u> at the contest if you haven't already done so (this is a requirement in order to compete in the contest).

At the registration table you will find blank tune sheets; complete one for Round 1 and leave it in the labeled bin. Your contestant number will be filled in by someone else. This is what the MC will use to introduce you and your tunes (you can change your tunes if you change your mind - no problem - and you can add your accompanists' names later also). Then you proceed to the Practice Room where you can find one, two, or three accompanists and run through your tunes (you may have to wait in line since they are in demand). Approximately ½ hour before your division starts, an Order of Play will be posted on walls in several locations, including the Practice Room. Once your division starts, you will need to pay attention and be back-stage with your accompanists while the person before you is on stage. There will be volunteers around to help you. There is a hallway near the back-stage where people can wait for their turn, and the Practice Room is nearby. The MC will introduce you and announce your tunes as you walk on stage. The judges are in a separate room and will not hear who you are – they will only hear your fiddling. You will not speak into the microphone. There will be a piece of duct tape on the stage which will show you where to stand in front of the microphone, and there will be someone there to adjust the height of the microphone for you. You will start playing after the MC says "judges, this is contestant No.\_

Your round will consist of a hoedown (square dance type tune with repeating 8 bar parts), a waltz (in ¾ time), and a tune of choice which is not a hoedown or waltz (rag, polka, jig, 2-step, schottische, swing, etc.) within 4 minutes or less (5 minutes in the Open Division) - (just stop long enough between tunes to take a breath, decide on your tempo, and get off to a good start on the next tune). It's a good idea to do some extra practice on the first few notes of your tunes so you can start each tune with confidence. When you start your first tune, be sure your accompanists are also ready. Any style of Oldtime fiddling is appropriate, whether it be Celtic, New England Style, Midwestern Old-Time, Appalachian Oldtime, Texas Oldtime, etc. It's not what style you play; it's how well you play it. Play tunes that you know really well and are comfortable with. Based on the judges' scores, the top 5 fiddlers in each division (except the Small Fry Division which is one round) will play Round 2. The scores will be added together to determine the order of the top 5. Round 2 will consist of a hoedown, waltz, and tune of choice that's not a hoedown or waltz, and must be different tunes than were played in Round 1. An Order of Play for Round 2 will be posted as soon as possible. If there's a tie in the top 5, an additional hoedown will be played. (See attached list of possible tunes.)

The information about the rounds pertains to the regular divisions – the Entertainment Showcase is one round of any type of fiddle tune you want to play and there are different rules – (rules are on the ootfa.org website). Even though 2 fiddlers can play together in this division, each fiddler can only appear on stage one time in the Entertainment Showcase.

The judges give each tune a number score up to 100 points. They will listen for such things as good rhythm, appropriate tempo for the tune and for the fiddler, good tone, clarity, intonation, overall musicality, etc. They may make notes on the score sheets if they want to point something out.

The stage is really comfortable. When you're on stage, don't think about the judges – have fun, be proud of yourself, and play for yourself and for the audience. You will most likely enjoy how you sound in the microphone, especially with the accompanists. If you start to feel nervous, push those thoughts away as fast as you can and just think about the tunes and how you're enjoying playing them. Everyone makes mistakes and they don't matter. Even people who get nervous generally want to do it again!

You can watch many contests on YouTube. If you want to watch some people you might recognize, take a look at the Willamette Valley Fiddle Contest 2019 – there are some recordings of all the different divisions.

Fiddle contests are a folk tradition going back hundreds of years. They are worth perpetuating and are a great way to put on a show, meet many other musicians, hear all kinds of great tunes, and motivate you to practice.

### HOFDOWNER Tune of the Month

This month's tune comes our way from the late great Kenny Hall, one of the few Oldtime sources from the West Coast. The song is generally credited to Percy Wenrich who wrote the music in 1908. (Percy also wrote Snow Deer, Silver Bell, and Moonlight Bay and many other tunes we're familiar with.)

But Kenny throws us a curve ball with this one: His Part A is Percy's Part B; but Kenny's Part B is not part of Percy's composition, and Kenny's book credits Harry Archer as the composer. Go figure!

Percy wrote Rainbow in the keys of E<sub>b</sub> and B<sub>b</sub>, but Kenny had the good sense to move it to G and D.

You can watch Kenny play this on YouTube, with his unique mandolin style, and you can download the audio free at slippery-hill.com.

Kenny performed this as part of his 'Indian Maiden Medley'. District 4 plays a subset of Kenny's Medley (Silver Bell, Redwing, and Snow Deer.) Search YouTube for 'Easy Winners Kenny Hall Medley' and you can hear the whole medley.

We are invited again to play for the Frontier Heritage Fair, February 15-16, at the Lane County Fairgrounds Auditorium in Eugene. Last year so many groups formed and signed up that we played both days and at least one group played twice. Some folks dressed in Civil War or other 1800s garb to add to the atmosphere and oldtime music.
