The **Winter Board Meeting** and jam is still scheduled in Lebanon on January 15-16, 2021


The State Fiddle Contest is on the schedule for March 20, 2021.



Back in the Day with District 6 Fiddlers: Wally Bloom

Wally made it clear at age 4 or so that he was a fiddler. Parents Willard and Bertha Bloom would find him curled up on the wood pile behind the kitchen range, asleep, an ash shovel under his chin for a fiddle, and holding a stove poker for a bow.

Born in 1925 in a homesteading family in southern Saskatchewan, Wally was soon playing with his fiddler-father, and guitar-playing mother and sister Lavina for dances in the schoolhouses and the nearby rural communities. He recalls winning a talent contest with teenage cousins playing the popular dance tunes of the day; the music most in demand at local dances. But from his uncle, Alfred Borgerson, Wally learned Norwegian tunes and the reels and jigs for the occasional Square Dance. In those cold Canadian winters, just getting to the dance was an adventure in itself.

As Wally tells it, "Every Friday night, and that was two winters, if I remember right, Uncle Henry had a team of oxen and he had a four by four foot little house, or caboose, we called it, built on the front of the bobsled, and we carried feed in the back, and wood, and there was a little stove--I believe Dad built it--with about a two-inch stove pipe going up, so we were nice and warm in there, and the lines come through the caboose. It took us three hours, if I remember right. One way it was eight miles. The oxen wouldn't travel over about two and a half miles per hour.

Lavina played what we called the Hawaiian guitar, Uncle Henry on the Spanish guitar, and Fred on the drums, I was the only lead. I was eleven, probably. We made a dollar and a half each".

Like so many fiddlers, work and needs of family preempted Wally's music for many years. But very soon after he arrived in the Willamette Valley in 1967. He attended a fiddle contest in Cottage Grove. It might have been Jimmy Miller who won that year. Inspired, Wally picked up his fiddle again, retrieving old tunes and learning new ones, mostly from Canada's polished, musically-sophisticated recording artists. King Ganum was a favorite, and Con Messer, Andy de Jarlis and Graham Townsend.

Wally joined OOTFA, played in some contests and took up sky-diving. (Yes there's a connection.) His greatest strength was in playing the swing tunes and Canadian Waltzes that set people dancing, rather than in contest sets, and his own compositions reflect his approach to the music, as anybody knows who ever heard him play his "Skydiver's Waltz" or "Skydiver's Jump".

I interviewed Wally, his parents and his sister in 1976, as part of the Oregon Fiddling Project. During the time I knew him, he migrated regularly between managing his parents Union 76 station in Crow and long periods in the area around Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. In Crow he lived in an apartment behind the station, and his fiddle cases were always open on the kitchen table. If he wasn't attending to a customer, he was playing his fiddle. He settled in Assiniboia, Saskatchewan, in his last years, and passed away December 31, 2011. I can still call up in memory the way he played. "Fire on the Mountain" and ``Hey Good Lookin," and especially the way he

played those Canadian waltzes, with such a lift to them.

Jude has made some recommendations:

- Please envision a 6 foot bubble around yourself and do your best not to pop that bubble. If you feel you can't maintain that distance, then you need to wear a mask.
- Singers need more like 10-15 feet space according to the public health authorities.
- When you come into the jam, please wait until everyone has made room for you to maintain proper distance. The fact that we are playing outside greatly reduces the chance of transmission, but it only takes one of us being contagious without realizing it for the rest of us to become ill.
