Most of the individual districts of OOTFA also have their own scholarship funds set up as well.

The purpose of these funds is to give instruction to those who are interested in learning to play the

My Musical Journey

I was born in Albany, Oregon April 9, 1939. I grew up in a musical family. My mother was a church organist for 60 years. She was 8th of 9 children. Our family reunions would resemble the whole **Hee Haw** group singing songs, playing instruments and dancing. My maternal grandparents were from Knoxville, Tennessee and my paternal grandparents were from Springfield, Missouri. My mother would take me and my two sisters to nursing homes as early as I can remember to sing for the residents. We would sing hymns, show tunes, folk songs and anything else somebody wanted to hear.

I learned to sing in front of audiences from the time I could stand up. Living on our farm in Tangent, Oregon during WW2 we had lots of time to sit around and sing songs. Gas was rationed so we didn't go many places except by train. I started piano lessons in the first grade and saxophone by third grade. When I was 11 years old my grandmother bought me a baritone Ukulele and an instruction book that said learn to play the Uke in 5 minutes. It worked. I played that Uke all the way into college and then found a tenor banjo and tuned it like a baritone Uke. The folk revival of the 60s was an inspiration to play what the Kingston Trio, Peter Paul and Mary and the Limelighters were playing. So, I bought a 5 string banjo and tried to play what they were playing. Finally, the Earl Scruggs instruction book was published, and my playing started to improve. My \$100 banjo just wasn't capable of playing anything above the 5th fret. So, I bought a \$1,000 banjo and began doing much better. I was even asked to join a band.

By this time, I was well into my career as an accountant and school business manager. When I was business manager for the **Redmond School District** some of the staff and local business folk formed a band called the **Dry Canyon Filharmonhik**. We played for the county fairs around the area, weddings, chamber of commerce events, and private parties. During the recessions of the 1980's I accepted a job as the business manager for the **Beaverton School District**. Here I met a lot of Portland musicians and formed

a new band called the **Sidekicks**. We ran yellow page ads in four counties and had all the gigs we could handle, about 60 a year. There was no internet in those days.

In 1995 I was offered the Business Manager position at the Salem School District and moved to Salem. I joined the Oldtime Fiddlers and got interested in western swing. George Taevs and several others had a band called Swingtime and asked me to join the band. This opened a whole new way of playing for me. I now had folk, bluegrass, country and swing in my music repertoire. The Oldtime Fiddlers have been such an enjoyable group to be associated with because of the wide range of songs that are played in jam groups and dances. At 82 years old I am very pleased with

my music journey, and I have so many people in the OOTFA to thank for their support.




One-Man Band Al Pierce is serving as Interim Vice-Chair for District 5

Then I attended the **University of Oregon** in 1960 where I was part of a 5-piece Jazz/Dance combo playing for various house dances and other performances over a 2-year period. My uncle in Salem was a fiddler and he provided a bass for me to use as long as I was in college. I ran out of money after my freshman year, and with the draft board in hot pursuit, I enlisted in the Navy in 1963. I had to give the upright bass back to my uncle and I could never afford to purchase my own bass until 45 years later.

After the G.I. Bill was extended to Viet Nam veterans, I enrolled at Lane Community College for one year and then transferred to Oregon State University and received my B.S. in Science in 1971. During that time, I met Patti, we married and have two wonderful children and the best 5 grandchildren ever. I was employed in the wood glue industry for the next 47 years.

In 2003, I experienced a serious health issue and decided I should play music again. In 2005, we attended the Annual OOTFA Convention at Polk County Fairgrounds and talked with several members about the organization. Having such a positive response,

I purchased my bass in 2006 from a lady in Scio that had been an OOTFA member and could no longer participate due to medical issues. In 2007, my luthier converted my bass from 4 string to a 5 string by adding a high "C" string which allows me play open strings which ring louder than "fingered" strings.

I have had 15 years in OOTFA making music, friends and at the same time making a contribution to the OOTFA organization in other ways:

- Served 2 yrs as District 6 Chair 2010-2012
- In 2012-13. I served as State OOTFA Vice President
- 2014 received Bill Yohey award at State Convention
- Was founding member of the West Cascades Fiddle Camp and Workshops (WCFCW).
- Obtained a District 6 sponsorship in 2007 which generated over \$20,000 thru 2019.
- Taught beginning Upright Bass at WCFCW for 8 years.
- In 2007, I found a more economical printing company for the OOTFA printing needs which has saved the organization several \$1000's per year.

I hope we can get back to "OOTFA's new normal" next year and be able to gather and play together again.


