In Memorium: Gynn Deaton

by Joe Ross Gynn Deaton was born Aug 7, 1931 in Northfield, Texas, "a town that went from 25 to 15." Farming and mining kept the family moving between Arizona, New Mexico and Texas. After the war, they moved to Visalia. California where Gynn met **Jim** in high school (his family was from Missouri).

They married when she was 17. His family had moved to Oregon, and she finished up high school in Canyonville. She worked as the City's recorder and still did bookkeeping and income taxes for clients. Jim worked as a sawmill lumber hauler, service station owner, then for ODOT. They had five children. Jim passed away on November 13, 2015.

Gynn's love of fiddle music came from her Texas grandfather and grandmother. "Dad and granddad bought a farm together. Neighbors would come over and play. It struck a chord with me. At dances, granddad played fiddle, and grandmother played piano. There was a love of that music among both sides of the family. An uncle was the New Mexico state champ and competed at Weiser." Gynn played violin herself in Arizona in the elementary school orchestra.

Gynn and Jim heard the **Oldtime Fiddlers** at the fairgrounds in Roseburg. For many years, they ran the kitchen and banquet at the convention. "We got to know others and made some of the best friends of our lives." Jim was OOTFA's State Vice President from 1982-83, and Gynn was OOTFA's State Secretary/Treasurer from 1978-80 and 1984-88. *continued on page 11*

Bustin' Out Jams with Judi Seger

My name is Judi Seger, of District 3. I am a Medical Laboratory Technician by trade, and lifelong Oregonian, born and raised in Portland, later living at the coast in Gleneden Beach, then in Eugene, and now having settled in Bend. I have played guitar since I was 12 years old, mostly being taught by my step-dad, **Ted Hunt**, now of District 8. I had a few piano lessons as a kid, but mostly just played by ear, having the unfortunate tendency to want to be

instantly good without practicing! About 8 years ago I became interested in learning to play the fiddle when I inherited my grandfather's violin. I never knew him but felt a connection with him when I held his old fiddle.

I took 4 lessons from Roland White and learned one song, "Ashokan Farewell". A little time went by and a friend, **Brenda Rose**, took me to the **Country Music Gathering** in Prineville, in September of 2016. I was in a difficult place in my life, having recently started chemo treatments for cancer and also having just lost my mom three weeks prior. I wasn't fiddling yet but had signed up to play guitar and sing a song ON STAGE! A terrifying prospect to someone who didn't care to be the center of attention.

I stood at the back of the hall, with a kerchief around my bald head, pretty much trembling in fear, and a SUPER friendly, energetic, annoyingly upbeat person was trying to talk to me. I say this tongue and cheek, because at the time I didn't know it was **Jeannette Bondsteel**, who I would later come to know and love. She encouraged me to be brave and go sing my song,when I wanted to back out. And I thought of my mom's strength through her health battles, so I got up and sang "Walking after Midnight" with other OOTFA musicians backing me up. And I was off and running with music after that! What a feeling! The Lights! The Applause! Okay... but it was a wonderful and affirming event in my life.

> I went to OOTFA gatherings at the **Powell Butte Community Center** when I could, and saw the fiddlers there having so much fun, so I decided to dust off my grandpa's fiddle. I began going to some Slow Jams for beginners led by **Jeannette Bondsteel** and **Marlene Stevens**. Those were absolutely priceless lessons, and their enthusiasm was contagious. Meeting other incredible musicians along the way, and going to more jams and gatherings

helped with my progress. I don't read sheet music but learn by ear. So unfortunately, I am one of those that calls a tune and doesn't know what key it's in. I am still more of a singer and guitar player, but also really enjoy fiddling, so it's been challenging to juggle two instruments at the jams and campouts.

I also started hosting a "**Jam Busters**" tent at campout gatherings for musicians to express any and all acoustical music forms, where folks play Oldtime, Bluegrass, Americana, Folk, Western, Swing and Blues tunes. So far no Rappers ... phew! But seriously, it is so fun to exchange songs and learn to play with others in a jam setting. Eventually I began going to open mic's and singing for strangers, and it has been OOTFA and friends who have given me the confidence and experience to do these new things.

The pandemic has been a challenge on all fronts, and I confess I put my fiddle down for too long. But upon picking it up again this winter, I was amazed that those tunes are still in there...they just need the rust shaken off with some practice! The one thing about the rifts this pandemic have brought about... they are not a factor when it comes to the universal connection we all feel with each other through music! **God Bless everyone in the New Year!**

A Passion for Life • Linda Parks

I wish I could say "Music is my passion" but I must say "Life is my passion" - a life filled with family (2 children, 4 grand children), friends, gardening, sewing, oil painting, tole painting, stained glass, counted cross stitch, a little square dancing now and then - and yes, Music! But music came later than my other interests.

Raised on a small farm in rural Minnesota, from a large family where **Daddy** worked 6 days a week and Momma didn't drive, it was impossible for me to take band class after school. But there was always country music playing in our house - at the breakfast table before school, and in the evening on radio or television as I poured over my homework. I was able to join the High School Choir and loved it. But as for playing music, when Jerry and I married in 1980 I had a cheap guitar that I didn't know the first thing about playing. For 11 years in Texas, as he struggled to learn the fiddle, I struggled to play with him. It wasn't until we moved back home to Oregon in 1992 and he soon joined the Oregon Oldtime Fiddlers that I started to go to the jams with him, sat in the back and still struggled to play a little guitar. One day at an outdoor event Willy **Carter** asked me to take a turn and sing a song (into the mic)! I was nervous, didn't sound very good, but decided I was listening to them sing and they were having a good time, some not singing too much better than me, so I sang - and from that day on I was hooked. I struggled to play the guitar better so I could

sing! I realized that a lot of people sounded a lot better than me, but some sounded just as bad as me - and some people even enjoyed the way I sang (or at least they said they did.) So I played and sang for those people and had a great time. Once day I realized I didn't have to be as good as Dolly or Emmy Lou - just had to always do the best I could - and I was never nervous again. Over the years, being involved in the Oldtime Fiddlers has now become the high point in my life. I have had countless wonderful experiences and made so many very good friends. Jerry and I attended the first **West Cascades Fiddle Camp** in 2011, and from that year to the present I have served as **Registrar/Treasurer** on the Committee. After several years of refusing, in 2019 I finally "caved" to **Sharon Thompson**, agreeing to be considered for **State Treasurer** so she could resign after serving 9 years as State Treasurer. I am thoroughly en-

joying this challenge and have learned a lot about OOTFA.
