## Information for Contestants by Contest Director, Eileen Walter

Arrive at the contest at least an hour prior to the start of your division. Stop at the **Membership Desk** and pay your OOTFA dues if you haven't already done this. Check in at the **Registration Desk**, pick up your name badge, grab a blank "tune sheet", fill it out as much as

you can (you may not know your contestant number or your accompanists names yet – you don't need to fill those in), and leave it in the designated box on the Registration Desk – the MC will be using this to introduce you.

Proceed to the "practice/warm-up room" where you can unpack,

tune up, and get connected with accompanists. There will be accompanists available (usually guitar & bass players) and if you don't already have one or more lined up, you will need to ask somebody if they'd accompany you (unless you're playing unaccompanied). Let your accompanists know what tunes you'll be playing (including the keys of your tunes), and ask if they have time to run through your tunes with you. You may need to wait in line for this opportunity, as the accompanists are in demand.

playing tunes that aren't well known. The "Order of Play" lists will be posted around ½ hour prior to the start of your division. Be ready to go on stage at this time, as things will move quickly.



Rules, Directions, Food & Lodging, Volunteer Info There will be volunteers with clipboards and lists who will assist you in getting from the practice room to the stage at the correct time. They will find you by your name tag and let you know that your turn is approaching. That's when you need to find your accompanists and let them know (they may already be on stage and you'll need to catch

them as you are going on stage), and start walking to the sanctuary. There is no "back stage" so contestants and accompanists will need to enter the sanctuary while the prior contestant is on stage, and be ready to walk onto the stage as soon as the prior contestant is exiting the stage. When you are on stage, take your time placing yourself in front of the microphone (someone will be there to adjust it for you) as the MC is introducing you. You can begin your round after you hear the MC say "judges – this is contestant # \_\_\_). Remember – there are many people there to help you.



This month I interviewed long-time OOTFA member **Penny Mead.** It was an absolute delight speaking with her for over an hour about her very interesting life. Penny is now nearing 100 years old (in July she will be 99) and began her musical life around 10 or 11. She was born during the depression in Montana, and her family became destitute and decided to move to Oregon where they heard life was much better. They built their own trailer house out of scraps of metal and then were off to a better life. On the way they met up with some people from Missouri who were also moving to Oregon. During the day this group picked fruit and hops, and every night they camped together and played music around the campfire.

Once the families got to Oregon they stayed nearby and continued to play together as a group for many years. Penny loved the music and eventually learned how to play the piano, upright bass, the guitar, the fiddle and other instruments. Penny's father bought 40 acres of land near Carver and all the family members including the kids (she had seven siblings) worked on the farm to make a living. They planted strawberries, hay, and had a large garden. Penny enjoyed telling me that there was a waterfall (Rock Creek) near the farm that the kids loved to jump in when they had a break for lunch. She said those falls are still there today and encouraged me to go see them.

As Penny and her siblings grew up the family continued to play music and Penny and her sister sang

together in their band. As a young girl she worked in the hop fields near her farm and made friends with other workers, and these teenagers all loved to go to the Rock Creek Grange for dances. Penny went to high school at Milwaukie High and worked in the office to pay for her books. She stayed in High School for a year but then World War II started and she had to go to work. Next month I will finish this article and you will learn that Penny once played in a big band with country music star Willie Nelson. ~

# Amelie Redman By Joyce Singer, Songwriter and Earth Advocate Orsini

Raised in Willamina, Oregon, Amelie Redman spent most of her first three years of life in Nicaragua, where her father, a mining engineer, worked on a project. Mostly she's lived in Oregon and California.

Amelie has chronicled her ideas, philosophies, and songs since she was a teenager. Her journal also includes stimulating viewpoints, poems, and expressions she's heard along her way, with sketches interspersed throughout. At the moment she is contemplating just what is a "premature afterthought."

Amelie took piano lessons as a child, played mellophone and French horn in grade school and flute in high school.

She loved to sing and wanted to play guitar for accompaniment. She was thrilled when she learned that the ukulele her parents had given her was the top four strings of a guitar. After college, Amelie saw a guitar mounted on a wall in a house she was visiting, and asked the owner "how much do you want for it?" It was hers for \$25. She taught herself to play the guitar and later, the harmonica, too.

Amelie would have loved to major in forestry or other natural conservation subject in college, but there were no such courses available where she was, so she focused on English literature and art education. She graduated from **University of Oregon.** 

Amelie wrote her first song for the wedding of a friend, "This is Who I am Without You." She later wrote "The World Would Be a Better Place to Live."

She loves folk songs that tell a story and loves equally to have fun with her music. Bubbling up from a defensive subconscious, she starts a feisty ditty with:

I just want to yell and fight.

I want you to say I'm right. ...

Way ahead of her time, in the early 1980's Amelie created "That's Recycling," a lively sing-along that cites examples of recycling.

In 1992 Amelie enlisted in Volunteers in Service to America (VISTA) in Alaska. She planned on staying there a year, but, wound up living there for sixteen years. She learned much and taught about recycling while there. She also got to sing and play at the Bethel Cultural Arts Center and other venues.

As a Hertz car rental agent for a short while at the San Francisco airport she got to meet many celebrities, most memorably Alfred Hitchcock and John Wayne.

Amelie created a game she calls Trashball – a ball made from recycled plastic bags is attached to an elastic string that returns the ball after you throw it. She crochets useful purses and tote bags from plastic grocery bags, also, and has taught others how to make them, too.

She has worked on recycling at a county landfill and taught recycling. She was involved in **McMinnville Yamhill County Recycling** before she retired.

Amelie is well-known throughout Yamhill and Polk counties for her environmental work, that includes teaching others what can be done. Always
