Rachel was nominated by her band teacher for the prestigious **Oregon Ambassadors of Music** and will be playing music in Europe this Summer. She will be playing the trombone and will be playing 14 different pieces. Only 400 students from Oregon have been chosen for this trip, which will be from July 6th-20th and will have performances in Austria, Germany, Switzerland, and France.

Rachel is a very talented musician and in addition to trombone she plays ukulele, mandolin, fiddle, guitar, and piano. She also sings and has just started learning the trumpet. Her family is very musical as well, and her family had a band called the 3 B's. Rachel has been playing the fiddle since she was 4 years old; she began playing the trombone in 5th grade, and began playing ukulele in 7th grade. In 6th grade, she was invited to play in the Jazz Band. She is currently a sophomore at Bandon High School and it is always a treat to hear her play music! In November, she attended band camp in Seattle, and played her trombone in a concert there as well.

Rachel has been working very hard to raise funds for her trip to Europe, and has received some money from The Rotary and the local community. Hello OOTFA members, hope you had a fun **April Fool's Day** and are enjoying flowers but not showers at this time. We have received a lovely invitation to play our music and to help **Sunnyside Grange** celebrate an open house on Sunday, May 1st at 2:00 PM. The invitation says there will be a short program and membership awards, and they are inviting all groups who have used the grange. There will be an information table and refreshments in the dining room. Sounds like a good time to play our oldtime music.

Our **Circle Jam** at the **Sunnyside Grange** in March was a lot of fun. We had 25+ people who attended—about 19 fiddlers, several guitars, a mandolin, an upright bass, and some singers! We played a lot of Irish music and some of the tunes were “Wearin’ of the Greens”, “Mountains of Pomeroy”, “Irish Washer Woman”, and “Road to Lisdoonvarna”. Our president, **David Altman**, conducted a business meeting where we elected officers for the coming year. David will be the Chair again, I will continue to be the Vice Chair, **Fred Davis** will continue to be the Treasure, and **Claudia Zinser** will continue to be the Secretary.

Now I will finish my story about **Penny Mead**. When **World War II** started Penny needed to get a job and she found one riding a bicycle delivering **Western Union** messages. She was called the **Telephone Girl** and was paid \$12 a week. She was also paid to deliver a singing telegram for someone's birthday which she enjoyed! Another job she had was to pump

gas at a service station and then drive the car home to its owner. (She took that job not telling the service station owner that she couldn't drive. He hired her, but she had to quickly find a place that would give her an official license, which she did.) After that she started driving delivery trucks to the shipyards. She was helping the war effort.

Once the war was over she got married and started a family, but continued to play in small bands. In one band she played with **Willie Nelson** who was just starting out. (When he left the band he became famous and she didn't see him again.) She loved playing with this local band because she wanted to have a family life and not travel all over the country. She also had a family band. Her son played bass fiddle and she and her sister played music and sang. They had a speaker system that was set up in the house all the time and stayed there. They had great fun playing together.

When she married **Walter Mead**, who was in the tractor business, she gave up her music for many years. In later years he became very sick and needed care. One of his nurses was District 7 member **Donna Foreman**! After 39 years of marriage he died. About this time she started playing with the **Oregon Oldtime Fiddlers**, and she was so happy to play music again and loved meeting all the OOTFA members. One of those members was **Barry Bloom**. After awhile they decided to get married and “take care of each other.” They have now been married for 26 years!

Penny talked to me about life having good times and bad times. We all know this. She has had some major health issues which were the bad times and the good times have been when she plays music and gets to dance with Barry. Penny had five children—two of her sons have died. She is the step-mother of **Jeff Walters** and lives nearby Jeff and Eileen. She has seven grandchildren and too many “greats” to count but there are five generations that Penny is a part of. Penny, thank-you for the honor of telling part of your very interesting life story.
