

We have been enjoying the snow the last few days. Easter almost always brings snow. Happy trails to all see you down the road.



Tune of the Month Special Thanks to David Altman of District 7 for providing Tune of the Month for March

This tune is categorized in traditional Irish music as an air. Airs are a traditional tune genre which confuse many fiddlers not as familiar with this oldtime tradition because the time signature can be 3/4 time, but also 6/8, 2/4, or even something else. The Chieftains popularized this tune for a wider audience, and it can be found on several YouTube videos, such as this one: Click here. Besides most often being played in the key of G, other versions are in D or C. This wonderful air dates back to the 1700s, and the composer is not definitively known. However, often South Wind (or another title for the melody) is attributed to the great Irish harpist, O'Carolan. Lyrics do exist which also date to the same period, and one often cited composer is Freckled Donal Macnamara from County Mayo.

OOTFA Needs Some TLC Feeling the finacial pains of more than two years of inactivity

OOTFA Lifetime Household Members are our older, cherished members. We love having their experience, expertise and history. Of the 505 households in our organization (as of 4-15-22), Lifetime Households constitute 48% of total membership. Nine years ago, it was only 22%.

We realize that the OOTFA Bylaws in Article III describes who qualifies for Lifetime membership and the dues requirement. This is what it says:

- Section 2 D: Lifetime members. Any member or spouse who has been a paid member for five (5) years and who reaches the age of seventy (70) shall be eligible for a LIFETIME membership.
- Section 3 C: Charter Members and Lifetime Members are not required to pay dues.

Another interesting fact is that of our current Lifetime Households, only 40% are paying dues; either \$20 for the emailed Hoedowner *or* \$25 to have the Hoedowner mailed. This means that 60% are enjoying the membership of being an OOTFA member but are not financially supporting our organization...OOTFA.

This is **our** organization. If our membership continue to age, these percentages will continue to increase. We **need** our Lifetime Members to financially support OOTFA, if not by paying dues, they could **donate** a little something to help. Where in the world is membership into an organization **FREE**. Even AARP requires support!!!

The acoustics in the hall will be improved with the help of Jack Kerr, who has offered a very generous gift to help cover the cost. Thank you very much, Jack!
