

The OOTFA Spring Convention started on Wednesday evening with a finger food potluck provided by District 10. Thursday morning was crazy, as we frantically set everything up in the three gigantic rooms of the convention hall. We had great fun watching master quilter, **Carol Sheffield** and her family hang over 100 quilts for our viewing (and buying) pleasure. Jamming began in the front lobby, welcoming folks as they arrived. **Carol Ferrera** did a lovely job decorating the raffle area!

Willamette Valley Fiddle Contest

This year's Willamette Valley Fiddle Contest will be held Friday, August 5, 2022 at the Benton County Fair in Corvallis, Oregon. This will be the 23rd year the contest has been held at this location and it is the second longest running fiddle contest in the state of Oregon! It is held outside on the Oak Grove Stage and there are lots of fun activities at the fair for the whole family!

The contest attracts fiddlers from all over the country, and we even have had children from Europe and Japan play. It is unique in that we have a Novice Division for fiddlers of any age who have never played in a contest before. This is the time for those who have been thinking about playing to get their fiddles out and tunes polished!

All contestants must play a hoedown, a waltz, and a tune of choice other than a hoedown or waltz. Contestants in the Novice and PeeWee Divisions (8 and under) only have to play one set of tunes. For all other divisions, there is one preliminary round in which all contestants play and the top five from each Division play a second set of tunes in the finals. By noon we had everything set up and **Jerry** and **Linda Parks** held their schottische lesson, which established an atmosphere of fun. The workshops were well attended with almost every workshop having at least 10 or more participants. The Band Scramble was the evening's entertainment and lasted until 9:30. The jams continued until around 11 pm.

Friday, the workshops began by 9 am and carried on until late in the afternoon. It was hard to find quiet spaces to hold the workshops and that is something we will work on next year, but what a cool problem to have; too many people playing music, right?

The Friday evening dance went well with all of the districts playing, and dancers out there showing their stuff. Saturday began with the **Annual OOTFA Membership Meeting** from 10 to 11:30 AM. **Marcel-Ia** handed out special trophy awards to the District Chairs and OOTFA State Officers and especially thanked out-going Vice President, **Donna Reuter**, for her two years in that position. The 2022 **Norm Nash Distinguished Service Award** was presented to **Patti & Ken Luse** for their hard work over the years. **Loita Colebank** from District 8 was awarded the **Bill Yohey Award.** In addition, several **National Treasurer Certificates** for those 80 years and older were presented.

This whole event was so much fun and I'm happy that everyone pitched in to help. When there were bumps in the road, folks just hitched up their jeans and carried on with a minimal amount of fuss. Several years ago an historical landmark in Eagle Point, Oregon burned to the ground. One Christmas morning the Butte Creek Mill was reduced to embers. The Eagle Point community, administered by the Butte Creek Mill Foundation, raised it from the ashes and rebuilt the mill just as it had stood on the same spot for over 130 years.

On Saturday, May 7, District 4 musicians had the pleasure of playing their oldtime tunes on the front porch of the newly rebuilt mill for **Vintage Fair Days**. The public, undeterred by the cold, damp weather, filed through the two lines of musicians to view the inner workings of the mill and shop in the store.

The musicians tried to dispel the gloom of the day with cheerful tunes even as the wind blew and chilled fingers tried to find fiddle notes and guitar chords.

* An example of Tohono O'odham Fiddle Music as played by the Gu-Achi Fiddlers. This tune and several others have has become popular with many old-time fiddlers. A web search for Gu-Achi fiddlers will turn up several recordings of the music.

The Tohono O'odham are native Americans living near Tucson, Arizona. According to a University of Arizona publication (msw.arizona.edu/content/tohono-oodham-fiddle-music), "O'odham fiddle music was a result of the arrival and influence of European missionaries, which began in 1539." [...] "The Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries taught their European instruments to the Tohono O'odham communities so they could play music for Catholic masses and other Church occasions. ... It is believed that the American 49'ers traveled through the San Xavier community. This is probably where the Tohono O'odham learned the polka, mazurka, waltz and schottische dance music." The music was played for several types of dances, typically on two fiddles with guitar and drum accompaniment. Many of the tunes evolved, and are now what we would call "crooked", meaning they have extra or missing measures or half-measures here and there, compared to the original tunes, or to most tunes in these styles.


Saturday, June 18th is our monthly Membership Meeting (11:00-12:00) and Circle Jam (12:00-3:00)

> Around 1980 he started playing in small groups in Estacada. About this time he discovered **Oregon Oldtime Fiddlers** and got involved with workshops and group lessons with **Carol Ann Wheeler. Bob Huffman** took him under his wing and they did a lot of playing together. They even went to Alaska, broadcasting out on a Yukon Radio station.

> Gary has played his saw for many years; on the streets of Portland, at Saturday Market, and at the Sunnyside Grange last week. He says that his inspiration to play music is probably genetic. His grandmother's brother was a famous gypsy violin player from Slovakia and his father was a very good player even into his later years. That "gene" was probably passed on to his granddaughter who is a good musician, too.

Gary has said, Why do I enjoy the music so?" His favorite quote is: "Music washes from the soul the dust of everyday life." Great! Thanks for sharing your musical background, Gary. We look forward to seeing you again at the Sunnyside Circle Jam.
