

# HOEDOWNER Tune of the Month

This month we are trying something a little different for **Tune of the Month** thanks to a suggestion and contribution from David Altman. Dave has taught technique to many fiddle students, and here he shares tips on bowing.

# Bowing for Fiddle Music by David Altman

While many fiddlers want to focus on the violin instrument rather than its bow, we often underestimate how importantly the bow contributes to the sound. In addition, because many fiddlers rely on transcriptions, and transcriptions are absolutely not able to completely capture bowing syncopations for a "correct fiddling style" (as opposed to classical music compositions), the tunes just end up not sounding like they should. Please note that the typical orchestra has all violinists attempting to bow in unison, whereas a group of fiddlers usually produce a conglomeration of bowing in all sorts of configurations.

From the historical perspective, bows definitely predate any instrument resembling a fiddle or violin by thousands, or more likely by tens of thousands, of years. Some musicologists even support the theory that a musical instrument bow was originally just an adaptation of hunting bows. To briefly digress on the historical context, we should note that our bows require a combination of a special type of rosin, a stick of wood (the ideal established is pernambuco wood), and horsehair. Taking these characteristics into account, the origin of modern stringed instrument bows is generally accepted to be from the Middle East or Central Asia, starting around the 10th century. These precursor fiddle bows were applied to plucked string instruments in the Mediterranean region, including lyres, lutes, rababs, and rebecs. While primitive fiddles (and their bows) existed much earlier, probably the first acclaimed violin bowmaker was Andre Amati during the 1500s in Cremona, Italy. Others such as Stradivari contributed to modifications, but the fiddle or violin bow assumed its current key features in the early 1700s with French bowmakers, especially François Tourte.

So why is it nearly impossible to transcribe fiddle bowing? The simplest explanation is that fiddle music doesn't have an exact bowing sequence. Rhythmic patterns matter a great deal for fiddle music as

accompaniment to dancing, which most often requires a combination of slurs, grace notes, and syncopated emphasis that centers on what fiddlers often call a shuffle. Shuffles are given a variety of names, such as the Georgia shuffle, the Nashville shuffle, the double shuffle, the pentatonic shuffle, and others. This introduction will focus on the Georgia shuffle, which I learned from the fiddler/violinist Alan Jabbour who was from Florida and came to the West Coast as a Professor at UCLA before his musicology career at the Library of Congress.

While the Georgia shuffle can be applied easily to most tunes in 2/4 and 4/4 time signature, remember that any shuffle does not usually sound right to be continuously applied in a monotonous arrangement, which goes back to the reason one transcription won't work very well with standard notation for emphasis, slurs, and bow direction marks. I prefer to teach the Georgia shuffle for chords initially before asking beginners to improvise the shuffle freely for specific tunes. This technique also can work for other shuffles such as the Nashville shuffle, which was supposedly popularized by studio fiddlers in Nashville who wanted to add a flair with simple chords while awaiting their solos on country, bluegrass, and other recordings. Here is a practice sequence for 2 possible chords in the key of G: continued next page


Georgia Shuffle for 2 chords in G



You will see that rather than beginning with a down bow, you start with an up bow. The pattern continues with a down bow for the offbeat with one note, followed by an up bow slur of three notes.

This arrangement should include more emphasis on the single down bow in order to create the driving syncopation. Once you feel confident with the pattern, the next step is to take any fiddle tune in 2/4 or 4/4 time that has either continuous eighth or sixteenth notes and start applying the same concept. Many of our standard reels are good to go with the Georgia shuffle, such as Soldier's Joy, 8th of January, Turkey in the Straw, Arkansas Traveler, Leather Britches, Mississippi Sawyer, Liberty, Boil Them Cabbage Down, etc. Here is an example of the Georgia shuffle bowing with bow direction marks and slurs I've inserted in part of a transcription of Arkansas Traveler from The Sessions which was posted without any of these markings:

Of course, getting into the rhythm means that the pattern can't always be 3 notes slurred with an up bow and one note down, followed by 3 notes slurred with an up bow and one note down, etc. In this example of Arkansas Traveler, the pickup portion at the end of the A section requires 4 notes slurred with the beginning of the Georgia shuffle and another improvisation for the fourth measure.

Shuffles can be applied to other types of songs such as rags, jigs, and many others. Just as any transcription played repeatedly gets monotonous, try experimenting with mixing up several different shuffles or combining shuffles with other bow techniques and ornamentation.


